Synod Update: Recent statement by the Bishop: All of the written responses which have been submitted are being worked on by a team of eight people; one priest and seven lay people. The synthesis should be completed by the end of the month (March) and the Bishop will respond to the synthesis with his discernment. The Bishop will present the discernment in a Liturgy of the Word and Eucharistic Adoration at the Cathedral on 3rd April. A document with the synthesis and discernment will be ready to be sent to the parishes in readiness for Palm Sunday.

Our Next Steps:To continue the listening and dialogue beyond this process with our priest and deacons in order to develop a local parish plan. All parishioners, including Synodal participants, will be invited to form a Synod steering group to develop and implement our parish plan.
